Food Pantries

If you need food to prevent hunger, York County has a network of food pantries that can help. You can...

- Search for a food pantry by zip code on the Central Pennsylvania Food Bank's website, Centralpafoodbank.org, or call **1-717-724-3190** Mon. – Fri. from 8 a.m. – 4 p.m. (Se habla Español).
- Call 211 – 24 hours a day, 7 days a week
- Search a list of York County Food Bank partner agencies hosting food pantries, soup kitchens, and free community meals, visit Yorkfoodbank.org/partner-locations/.

Volunteers with food pantries and the York County Food Bank are taking steps to lower the chance of spreading COVID-19.

Here's how you can help:

- **Send only one person to get the food.**
- **Make room in your trunk in case the site is a "no-touch, drive-thru" site.**
- **Wear a mask.**

SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program)

SNAP benefits (formerly called food stamps) help people eat healthy by stretching their food dollars at grocery stores and supermarkets. If you qualify, you'll get a debit card with a monthly amount of money to use for groceries.

New! - SNAP Online Purchasing Pilot Program

Only eligible food items normally covered by SNAP can be purchased online with SNAP benefits using an electronic benefit transfer (EBT) card. You will need to use another method of payment, such as a credit or debit card, to pay for any items not allowed by SNAP, delivery feeds or driver tips. 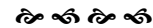

Programs for Kids

Women, Infants & Children Program (WIC)

(See income guidelines below.)

This special program helps pregnant women and mothers with children under age 5 with food, health screenings, and nutrition information. Summer vouchers (Farmers’ Market Nutrition Program) are also available to redeem at local farm markets. The Community Progress Council-WIC offices are temporarily closed to the public. All new applications and current client appointments are by phone, with electronic eWIC cards mailed to clients.

Programs for Seniors

Senior Box Program

Once per month, income-eligible seniors (60+) can get a free box of healthy food. For pick-up locations and to sign up, call the York County Food Bank at **717-846-6435 x 209**. In keeping with social distancing practices, many locations are offering “drive up” distribution and are allowing a “proxy” to pick up the box. (See income guidelines below)

Take-Out Meals

Take-out meals are available at York County senior centers for any resident 60 years of age or older. Call your local senior center for more details and to sign-up for a take-out meal. Home Delivered Meals

Home delivered meals are available to a York County resident in a non-institutional setting, 60 years of age or older with a disability which prohibits the individual from leaving his/her residence, living alone or with someone who also meets these criteria.
